I hope you are all enjoying the warmer weather and sunshine as the summer is approaching. Please do remind your children to bring a hat on sunny days and make sure their clothing is labelled, especially jumpers and cardigans. Please could we remind parents to apply sun cream to your children before they come in to school as we are unable to apply sun cream at school. Children are asked to wear their Summer PE kits during their PE. We also ask children who are wearing boots to School, to wear black shoes instead to follow our uniform policy. Thank you for your support in making sure everyone at Andrews' looks so smart and shows their pride in being a member of our school community.

We will be celebrating the Queen's Platinum jubilee on Friday 27 May at Andrews' Endowed with an event at the end of the day. All classes will be coming out to the front of the School to sing the first verse of the National Anthem. In celebration of the Queen's Jubilee, we will be planting a pendulous willow-leaved pear during the celebration. The classes will then come together and have time to have a small afternoon tea picnic. We ask for families to provide a small afternoon tea picnic for their child e.g. a sandwich and a piece of fruit. Family members are welcome to join in the celebration and bring a blanket to have a picnic with their child/children from 3:00pm. Please come to the playground gates if you wish to join us. At 3:30pm we will be having a cake sale from the PTFA's Jubilee cake competition. After School Club will still be running on this day, so if you are unable to join your child, but would like your child to buy a cake please send 50p in a named envelope on the morning of the event and this will be passed to the After School Club leaders.

At the mid point of this week, the whole school attendance was 95.6% for the whole year. We appreciate that this has been a difficult school year in terms of illnesses. The wellness of our children is very important to us. We also recognise there is a very delicate balance to ensure the children receive as much of their learning as possible. If your child is at school for only 90 per cent of the school year then they will have missed 19 days - almost four whole weeks of school. For primary-age children, this can mean almost 120 guided learning hours. This is a big gap for any child to make up. We would like to thank all our children and families for supporting the school in improving our attendance.

During break times and lunch times, I am seeing an increase of toys and Pokémon cards coming in to School. There has unfortunately been a number of upsets on the playground linked to these Cards. Due to the cost of them and the misunderstanding of children with swapping cards, I am asking for both Pokémon cards and toys to remain at home. Please can you help your child make the correct choice and not to bring them in School.

We have a 'We wish you well' to make. All the best for Siena (Year 2) who has got a new adventure ahead of her. We will miss having you as part of the Andrews' Endowed family.


Special Mention

Wellbeing Tip Of The Week

Getting the most from Sleep

Do you feel as though you are getting enough sleep at night? Do you have problems falling asleep or staying asleep? The NHS recommends that we have 7-9 hours of sleep each night, and up to 10 hours for younger children.

Here are some tips to help us get the most from sleep: Try to sleep at the same time each night, and wake up at the same time each morning,


- Avoid taking naps after 3pm, and don't nap for longer than 20 minutes.
- Avoid caffeine after 2pm, if you are sensitive to its effects.
- Exercise regularly but try to avoid this within 2-3 hours of bedtime.
 - Follow a routine to help you relax before sleep (e.g., reading or listening to music).

Everything Eco

Unfortunately Terracycle have now stopped the crisp packet recycling scheme so we are no longer able to accept crisp packets. Over the last couple of years Ms Banks has sent off over 50 kgs of crisp packets. This has been over 22,000 packets. This is such an accomplishment and Ms Banks would like to thank everyone for such a team effort. Please visit www.recyclenow.com to see where you can recycle your crisp packets going forward.

We still need your help though! There are still lots of ways we can help reduce waste and raise money for the school through terracycle. Ms Banks can now collect the following:

BabyBel (all packaging, including wax and net bags) - please put these separately in the smaller tub;

All brands of biscuit, cracker and cake bar plastic wrappers and packaging (this includes packets from Mini Cheddars or similar own brands, Twiglets and multipacks of mini packets of biscuits such as Iced Gems, cookies, Animal biscuits etc

Kinder rigid plastic, flexible plastic, aluminium foil and chocolate bar packaging—this includes the plastic toys and yellow plastic 'eggs' that they are contained in;

LOL Surprise Products and packaging

Pringles Tubes (but not plastic lids).

Please put any of these items in the plastic box inside the pedestrian gate. Ms Banks does try to empty the box as often as she can. If it is full please let the office know. Other Terracycle can also be recycled. Terracycle UK website shows what waste streams Ms Banks participates in.
