**'Groundforce Day'**

The front fences and gates were woodstained, the front beds were weeded, all the benches and picnic tables were given a fresh coat of teak oil, the House Garden seating and the two playhouses were all re-painted, part of the outdoor classroom was re-stained, the long pew was stripped back and oiled, the Acorns and Y1/2 picnic benches were cleaned and painted, and the PE shed and Y1/2 Storage sheds both got a new coat of woodstain. One of the new sheds in the Acorns outdoor area got a lovely coat of purple paint, and the Storytelling Garden Shed roof was repaired. ## **School Lunch, Breakfast Club, After School Club and Class Trip payments**

Please ensure that all school lunches, Breakfast Club and After School Club sessions are paid for **in advance or on the day that the meal/session is taken**. Also if you have advised that a trip will be paid on line and the trip has now taken place we would be grateful if you could make the payment via SCOPAY – thank you.

## **Lost Property**

Please ensure that **all** items of clothing, drink bottles and lunches boxes are clearly named with your child's full name including all "mufti" clothes worn to school. If it is named we will endeavour to get it back to its owner!

## **Dressing for the Weather**

Please ensure that your child is always sent in to school with their school jumper and a raincoat, plus a sunhat on sunny days. Sunscreen should be applied before school – children may bring in sunscreen if absolutely necessary, but they must be able to apply it themselves. Sunscreen must be labelled, and handed in to the class teacher, not stored in the cloakrooms. For safety reasons, we do not allow children to wear sunglasses in school, unless they are part of an optician's prescription.

## **Birthday Books**

Don't forget to return the slip requesting a "birthday book" the Wednesday before your child's birthday. Your child will then get the opportunity to select a book of their choice which they will get the chance to show to the school at the next Celebration Worship.
