**Staffing Changes after Christmas**

Sadly, we will be saying goodbye to Mrs Jane Fitzgibbon (Y3 Teacher) at Christmas, as she has made the difficult decision to take a break from teaching to focus on her family. Jane has been a much valued member of our staff team for many years, starting out as a Learning Support Assistant, before going off to train as a teacher and then returning to teach with us for the past six years, and we will miss her greatly.

Mrs Sarah Pooley (who currently teaches two days a week in Year 5) is moving to Year 3 after Christmas, teaching from Monday to Thursday, with Mrs Alison Vaughan teaching Year 3 on Fridays.

Mrs Annie Vincent will be teaching in Y2 on Monday and Tuesdays once Mrs Jenny Hudd goes on Maternity Leave, with Mrs Michelle Reid continuing to teach Y2 from Wednesday to Friday.

Mrs Sarah Poulton will continue to teach Y5 from Monday to Wednesday, with Mrs Annie Vincent teaching in Y5 on Thursdays and Fridays.

Children in Year 3 have already been introducing themselves to Mrs Pooley, and she will be available to meet with parents informally at pick-up after school on the first few days back in January, or you could pop and introduce yourself to her on the playground on Thursdays and Fridays this term, when she is seeing Year 5 out at the end of the day.

**Reverse Advent Calendar**

This year we will be collecting items for our partner school, Kitehge Primary School in rural Kenya.
