

Expectations

- Achieve the expected standard of a child at the end of Year 6.
- Completion of homework – around 2 hours each week.
- Use Mathletics to develop Maths understanding.
- Individual reading completed at home to be notated within the reading journal – comprehension of reading a variety of genres.
- Learn the spelling rules of the spellings.
- Bring/ wear PE kits when needed for PE.
- Be confident with their times tables.
- To have strong partnership between the home and the school.



Routines

English or topic/creative homework, along with Maths, Spellings and Reading homework will be given out each week on a Thursday and due back in the following Tuesday. This should equal around 2-2.5 hours of work per week.

Spelling tests on Thursday

Mathletics and other online logins will be stuck into cover of Homework books.

PE will be on Monday afternoons and Wednesday afternoons to start with.

My PPA to start with will be on a Wednesday Morning, and Miss Hunt will be teaching RE and Music, along with SPaG sessions during her morning.
